Scholarships Support Future Historians

The Dunham House Educational Foundation provides financial assistance to students who are underserved yet motivated to attend college to study in the field of history. In 2017, the foundation awarded a Presidential scholarship for \$2500 and two Senatorial scholarships of \$1000.

The scholarships, available to Indiana high school seniors and post high school students, were established in the spirit of The Dunham House built by William Riley Dunham in the 1880s. Dunham is an ancestor of the 44th United States President Barack Obama and represented Hamilton and Tipton counties in the Indiana General Assembly in 1913-1914. Then Senator Obama visited the home during the 2008 presidential campaign.

Indiana 7th District Congressman Andre Carson congratulated the recipients in a letter and thanked The Dunham House for its efforts on behalf of future generations.

Applications for the 2018-2019 DHEF scholarships are now being accepted.
