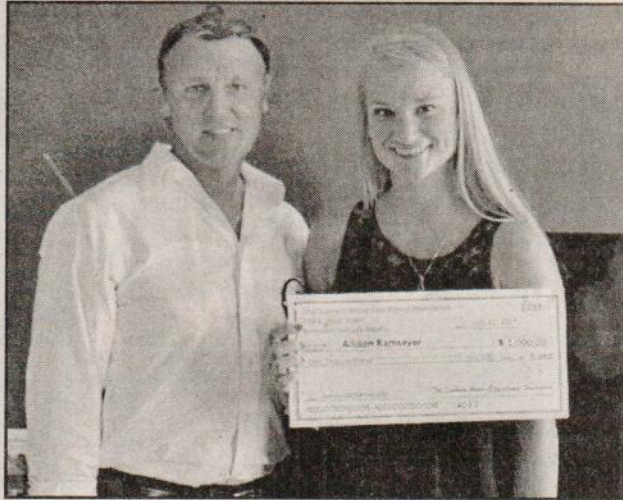

Indiana students win Dunham House Educational Foundation Scholarships

KEMPTON — Three Indiana students have been awarded college scholarships from The Dunham House Educational Foundation for the 2017-2018 school year. The foundation provides financial assistance to students who are underserved yet motivated to attend college to study some aspect of history.
